

Click Export button. Enter values as pictured below:

For portrait orientation select **Short Edge**. Everything else the same.

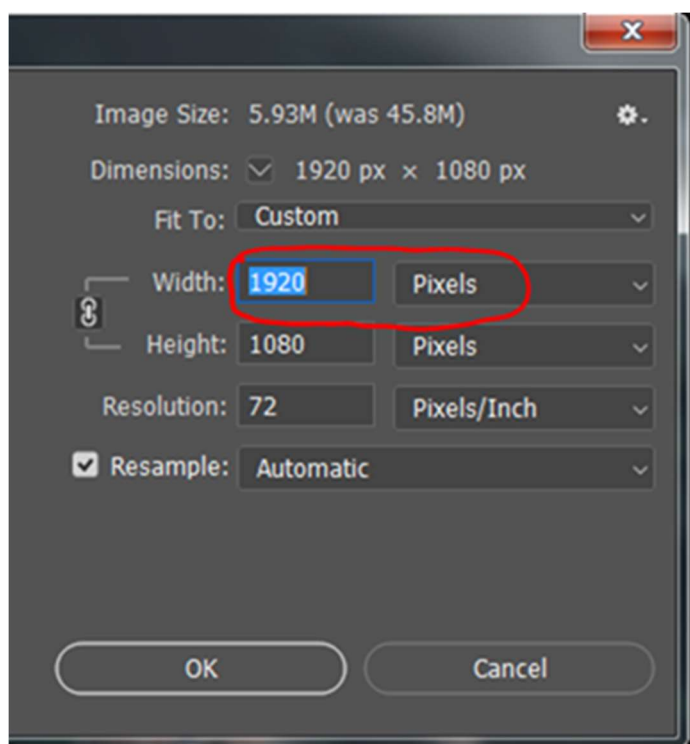


PHOTOSHOP CC, ELEMENTS - RESIZING LANDSCAPE ORIENTATION IMAGE

In Photoshop CC from file menu select "Image > Image Size"

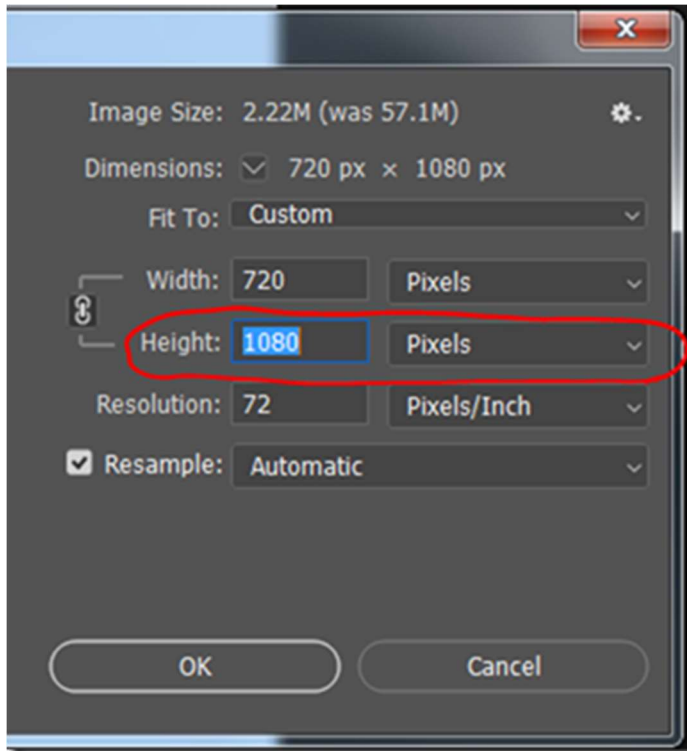
In Photoshop Elements from file menu select "Image > Resize > Image Size"

Make sure Link Icon is enabled. This maintains the aspect ratio.



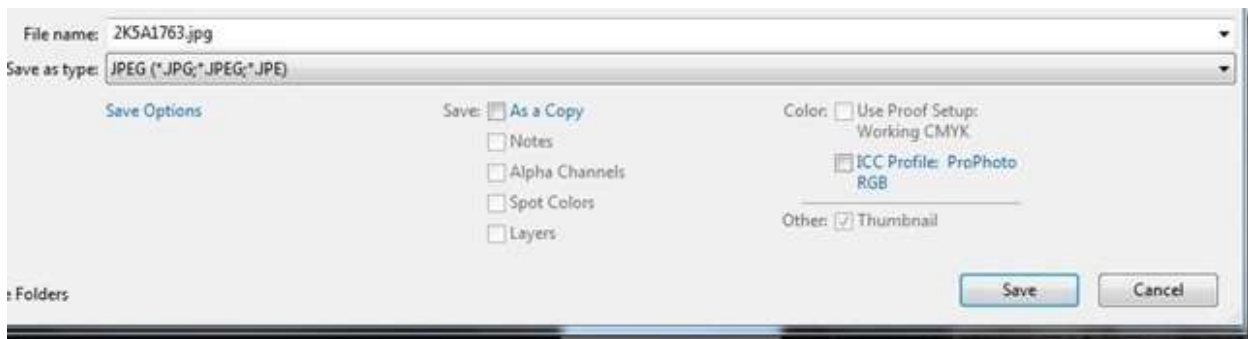
PHOTOSHOP CC, ELEMENTS - RESIZING PORTRAIT ORIENTATION IMAGE

In Photoshop and Photoshop Elements change Height to 1080. Everything else the same.



PHOTOSHOP CC, ELEMENTS – To Preserve Camera Metadata so that it will show up in slideshow

Select “File > Save AS...”



Click Save. Set JPEG Image Quality to 10
